

EVENT DATA RECORDER CONDITION

This endorsement is a part of your Personal Auto Policy and it changes your policy. Except for the changes it makes, all other terms of the "Policy" remain the same. Please read it carefully. This endorsement applies only when the number for this endorsement is noted on the Declarations.

The following definition is added to **COMMON DEFINITIONS**:

"Event Data Recorder" or "EDR" is a device installed in a motor vehicle that records data about the motor vehicle and occupant information before, during, and after an accident. It is sometimes also referred to as a "black box."

The following is added as part **F.** in **PART V: DUTIES AFTER AN ACCIDENT OR LOSS.**

"You" or any owner or lessee of "your covered auto" must allow or provide consent or authorization, including written, for "us" to access, obtain, and use any information or data that "we" deem relevant to the facts of the accident or loss from any:

1. Global Positioning System (GPS);
2. navigation system or device;
3. video service;
4. maintenance device;
5. "Event Data Recorder" ("EDR") device;
6. any other device recording driving data, including any telematics device or remote or cloud storage of driving or accident data; or
7. other similar device, that is installed, used, present or integrated in "your covered auto."

This applies to data or information that is stored in "your covered auto," in a device attached to "your covered auto" or in a separate device, regardless of whether the device is physically attached to or present in "your covered auto."

Compliance with this request is a condition precedent to coverage under this "Policy." If "you" or any owner or lessee of "your covered auto" refuse to provide "us" written consent to access, obtain and use the GPS, navigation system or device, video service, maintenance device, "EDR," or other similar device that records driving data and is installed, used, present or integrated in "your covered auto" and the information and data recorded in the device within fifteen (15) business days of our request, then "we" will not be liable for coverage.
